Pass this information sheet on to all adult supervisors coming to Sydney Zoo

- Allocate adults to supervise groups of students. We recommend no more than 10 students per group
- See if your class can bring a waste free lunch or use the appropriate bins if there is any rubbish
- Remind students not to throw or drop anything into exhibits, animals can get very sick from accidentally eating items they shouldn't
- Encourage students to ask lots of questions
- No flash photography when looking at internal exhibits
- Ensure students respect other zoo visitors and all signs and boundaries
- Ask students to stay together in allocated groups – if anyone is lost or requires first aid, they can approach a Sydney Zoo staff member for help
- Please ensure students walk when on zoo grounds and do not to climb on any fencing
- Remind students not to tap glass fronts of enclosures and keep to the paths
